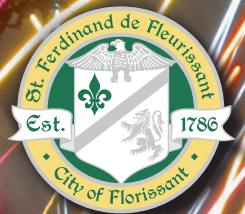

# Valley of Flowers Festival May 5, 6, 7, and 8, 2022

## "Valley of Flowers Celebrates Family Board Games"

Florissant, a city hosting festival entertainment for families, marks the arrival of the 60th celebration of the Valley of Flowers Festival, Florissant and North County's "first festival of spring." You can look forward to a variety of new attractions as well as the Grand Parade and the crowning of Florissant's Queen and her Court! After two years with only virtual events to celebrate, 2020 the 100th Anniversary of the Saint Louis Zoo and 2021 Missouri's Bicentennial, it's time for a live event so that we can overcome Covid-19's interruption together. The Valley of Flowers Committee, the City of Florissant and the Knights of Columbus are still in the planning process. This year Mother's Day falls on May 8, so special attention will be given to activities that Moms, Dads and kids can enjoy together. Details are not finalized but we can share some highlights with you. We encourage you to watch for updates from The Valley of Flowers Committee through our website [www.florissantvalleyofflowers.com](http://www.florissantvalleyofflowers.com) and our Facebook page [Florissant Valley of Flowers](https://www.facebook.com/FlorissantValleyofFlowers).

This year welcomes the return of the "Family Knight" on Thursday, May 5 at the Duchesne Home Association Grounds (Duchesne Grounds formerly the Knights of Columbus Grounds) where only families may enter and each ride is only one (1) ticket. Activities during rest of the three-day festivities will also appeal to all ages. At the James J. Eagan Center fair-goers will find culturally diverse performances, musical entertainment, a vendor/craft fair, a pretty baby photo contest, and children's activities. Carnival games and rides for families are featured at the Duchesne Grounds. Also around town visit the classic car show on Saturday down rue St. Francois, participate in the Volksmarch, visit the Historic Log Cabin at Tower Court Park on Washington St. at South New Florissant Rd., see a Lacrosse demonstration at the Eagan Center soccer field, and of course enjoy mouth-watering food everywhere.

The Grand Parade on Sunday, May 8, the highpoint of the weekend, leads to the crowning of the Valley of Flowers Queen and Court at the Duchesne Grounds Pavilion. Decorated vehicles and floats proceed west on Parker Road to New Florissant Road where the walking units and the marching bands merge with them. The parade travels south on New Florissant, turns west on rue St. Francois past the official review stands, then left on St. Ferdinand to Washington Street and concludes at the Duchesne Grounds. Please arrive early to get good seats along the parade route for one of the largest and most colorful spring parades in the St. Louis Metropolitan area; then join us at the Duchesne Grounds Pavilion for the exciting award and crowning ceremonies!

The parade theme is the "Family Board Games" so decorations on floats and units reflect this theme. Participating in the parade are many city officials, local municipal emergency responder vehicles, the Valley of Flowers reigning Queen and Court and this year's candidates, car clubs, walking units, horse groups, dog clubs, dance schools, and scout groups. Groups that make up the fabric of our community participate and create a colorful and fun parade! The parade ends at the Duchesne Grounds where the winning parade units and their sponsors, and the Pretty Baby Photo Contest winners receive their awards. At 4:00 p.m. Mayor Tim Lowery crowns the 2022 Valley of Flowers Queen and Court.



### The 2022 Parade Marshalls are Gary Behlmann's Family

This year's parade Marshalls are Karen Behlmann and family: Barbara Behlmann; and Kari, Chris, and Gabriel Kenyon. They are representing Karen's deceased husband Gary Behlmann and his efforts with Angie's All Inclusive Playground.

Gary was a lifetime Florissant resident who married Karen in 1972, remained with her in Florissant where Kari and Angie were born. Later they adopted Charlene and Barbara. His daughter Angie had many health struggles and succumbed to them at the age of 7. Gary's dream to build an all-accessible playground in memory of his daughter Angie led him to be the force behind Angie's All Inclusive Playground at Manion Park.

After visiting Zachary's Playground in Lake St. Louis, built by Unlimited Play, Gary formed the not-for-profit, Accessible Play, Inc. He educated, advocated and fundraised to build a playground for children of all abilities. Although Gary lost his battle to stage 4 pancreatic cancer in November, 2013, his dream moved to reality through the efforts of community supporters, friends, family and the hard work of volunteers. Angie's All Inclusive Playground (Grand Opening, planned for March 26, this year) will welcome everyone, young and old of all abilities to play side by side and celebrate each other's differences and love of play.

For the enjoyment of visitors, Thursday, May 5, through Sunday, May 8, the Duchesne Grounds on Washington Street between St. Ferdinand and Lindbergh Blvd. (N. Hwy 67) next to St. Ferdinand Shrine will feature carnival rides from Luehrs Ideal Rides, games, beverages, and traditional festival foods including their famous barbecue. Focused on families having fun together, rides will be available for younger children and families with the Grand Ferris Wheel for everyone. During the weekend the Knights will serve their delicious barbecue, hot dogs, hamburgers and more. Your favorite beverages will be in ready supply. Visit the other food and game booths, sponsored by local not-for-profit organizations, which will offer a variety of Festival foods and games.

On Sunday, watch the parade and experience the crowning of the queen and her court at the large pavilion on the grounds. Awards will be presented to the winners of the Valley of Flowers Parade and Pretty Baby Photo contest. Rides and activities will continue until close.

To maintain a family friendly and neighborhood atmosphere, the Knights will once again require that anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Other short-term changes allow for better crowd management and traffic flow in and around the festival grounds. The plan includes temporary traffic regulations to prevent festival traffic from interfering with local businesses, a well-enforced dress code and increased overall security. Also this year there will be a new layout for rides and ticket booths. There will be standalone, self-service ticket kiosks. Finally, all ticket booths will be equipped with credit card machines for added convenience. The Luehrs Ideal Ride tickets never expire so if you have some left from the last festival bring them.

We invite everyone to come and to enjoy a weekend of fun and friendship at the Duchesne Home Association Grounds.

A Washer Tournament will be held at the Eagan Center on Saturday as well as a Dance Performance. For Friday and Saturday we are planning for music as well as entertainers who will roam the grounds and perform their shows.

### **Gardeners of Florissant Plant Sale**

The local Gardeners of Florissant, a not-for-profit organization, will sponsor the Festival plant sale. ### **Walk in the "Volksmarch"**

The St. Louis Stuttgart Volksmarch Club will sponsor the free "People's Walk" which is a non-competitive, recreational, family-time stroll through interesting and scenic areas. Volksmarchers may (for a small fee) keep track of their event/distance in official record books that will be available. Along the way, many of the activities of the Festival will be highlighted as well as some of the historic homes located throughout Old Town Florissant.

### **Old Town Partners Car Show**

On Saturday Florissant Old Town Partners will host the ever-popular and spectacular Car Show which is set against the backdrop of the historic business district of Old Town Florissant along rue St. Francois. The open-class show will feature about 150 cars from St. Pierre Street to Lafayette Street. Through traffic will be closed and only cars in the show will be allowed admittance before 8:00 a.m. until shortly after the end of the show at 3:00 p.m. Enjoy the cars and take time to visit the retail shops in Old Town.

### **Pretty Baby Photo Contest**

The Pretty Baby Photo Contest will be held at the James J. Eagan Center on Friday and Saturday. The contest is for children two years old or younger. View all the wonderful photos of the children and cast your vote to help decide the winner. Entries are judged in two categories: "Personality" – as depicted in the photo and "Popularity" – demonstrated by donations from the public who vote at the booth. The winners will receive an award and gift basket at the awards ceremony on Sunday preceding the crowning of the queen and the court at the Duchesne Home Association Grounds. # HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Applications for the 2022 Home Improvement Program will be made available on April 1, 2022 and can be found online at [www.florissantmo.com](http://www.florissantmo.com) under the Community Development Department tab or in the Community Development Office. Completed applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis starting Monday, May 2, 2022 at 9am.

The Home Improvement Program offers forgivable loans to income eligible Florissant homeowners. Applicants must be Florissant homeowners and they must have owned and occupied the house for at least two years prior to application. The funds will first be used to address health and safety code requirements for the home. Any remaining funds may be used for other necessary home repairs.

Homeowners accepted into the program must remain in their home five years to have the loan forgiven. A seminar explaining the 2022 Home Improvement Program will be held on Tuesday, April 12, 2022 at 6pm in the Council Chambers of City Hall.

## Beautiful Home Awards

Nominations for the City of Florissant Beautiful Home Award Program will open May 1, 2022. The program was established to recognize homeowners who take pride in the appearance of their home and community.

In order to be eligible for the contest a home must be an owner-occupied single-family dwelling. Residents may nominate either their own home or other homes in the city. The judging criterion includes, but is not limited to, landscaping, attractive exterior, overall curb appeal and maintenance of the property.

One winner will be chosen from each of the city's nine wards. The winners will receive recognition from the City Council and a Beautiful Home yard sign. Previous winners must wait 3 years before consideration for another award.

## Home Safety While You Are On Vacation

With vacation season quickly approaching, the Florissant Police Department wishes to pass along a few tips to keep your home secure while you are on your trip:

- 1). Don't talk about it! Be cautious about who you tell about your trip. It is okay to tell a neighbor that you trust, but be careful about letting your whole neighborhood know that your house will be empty for an extended period of time. Also, don't post comments of social networking sites that you are leaving for a trip, or post comments while you are on vacation. You never know who is seeing those comments, and you don't want to advertise the fact that no one is at your house.
- 2). Use timers! Hook up timers to lights, televisions, and radios, and adjust the timers to your normal routine. This will help hide the fact that no one is home.
- 3). Lock up! Before leaving, make sure all of your doors, windows, garages, and sheds are secured.
- 4). Remember your mail! It is a good idea to request the post office to hold your mail while you are on vacation. This can be done either thru their website, or you can fill out a form at your local post office. Another option is to ask a trusted neighbor to collect your mail and newspapers while you are away.
- 5). Remember your answering machine and email! Don't tip anyone off that you will not be home by creating a new outgoing message for your answering machine saying that you are on vacation. Also, be cautious on what you put in automatic reply email messages.
- 6). Lock away your valuables! Keep valuables and important documents in a fire safe box or a safe deposit box. Also, it is always a good idea to record the serial and model numbers for your valuables so you can accurately report them missing if needed.
- 7). Park a car in the driveway! Give your home an appearance that someone is living there by asking a trusted neighbor to park his or her car in your driveway while you are away.
- 8). Outdoor lighting! Consider motion sensing lights on the outside of your house. Criminals typically do not want to be seen, so if a light comes on as they are walking around your house, it may prevent you from becoming a victim.
- 9). Make notifications! If you have an alarm system, make sure that they know how to get ahold of you while you are away. This can also be said about the trusted neighbor who is picking up your newspapers and mail, and who is parking a car in your driveway.
- 10). Complete a Vacation Check Form! The Florissant Police Department offers a free program to its residents where we check your house daily while you are on vacation. 

## Florissant Business Owners

The owner of any business located within the city limits, along with immediate family members living in their household, shall be deemed a resident and therefore eligible to receive a resident card. This applies to the individual listed on the business license only. To obtain a resident card as a business owner in the city, you must visit the JJE Center or JFK Community Center with a photo ID. You will only be issued a card upon verification of your business ownership and current business license through the Finance Department. This verification can only be done Mon-Fri 8am-4:30pm. It may take up to two business days to verify.

## Resident Card Information

A current Florissant resident card allows Florissant residents to do the following:

- Obtain a pavilion rental permit for one of our many parks.
- Register early for programs and classes (before nonresidents).
- Pay resident rates for admission to facilities, programs, and classes.

## To Obtain or Renew a Florissant Resident Card

Everyone in the household, including all children receiving a card, must be listed on the occupancy permit. This will be looked up in our system by recreation staff. Paper copies of the occupancy permit will be accepted for 60 days from the date of original issue only. In addition, residents who rent their home must bring a photo ID and proof of residency. Residents who own their home and are listed on the occupancy as the owner and occupant only need to bring a photo ID. See below for proof of residency requirements:

### 15 yrs and Under

- Must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian as proof of residency.

### 16-20 yrs

- May either be accompanied by a resident parent/legal guardian OR present a proof of residency item listed to the left in their own name

### 21+ yrs

- Utility bill showing service address that matches resident address. Electronic copies will be accepted. Must be dated within 30 days of current date.
- Paycheck stub (mailed or electronic stub), mailed bank statement. Must be dated within 30 days of current date.

Youth (4-17yrs)	\$4
Adult (18-59yrs)	\$5
Seniors (60+)/Veterans	\$4

Resident/nonresident cards are valid for two years from the date of purchase. If your card is lost during this time and you need a replacement, a \$5 fee for all ages will apply for each replacement card. Nonresidents wishing to purchase a daily facility pass must have a nonresident identification card which will be held at the reception or fitness desk and returned upon their departure from the facility. Nonresident card fees are the same as resident card fees. A photo ID or parent/guardian must be present (for minors under 18) in order to make a nonresident card.

**All resident/nonresident cards are the property of the City of Florissant and must be shown or surrendered to city employees upon request. For safety and security of our staff and guests, cards will be kept at the desk during usage of the facility and returned upon their exit.**

# Health & Fitness

## Fitness Center Rules & Policies

Liability release forms are required to be signed and are kept on file. Release forms are available at JJE Center and JFK Community Center. Please note fitness center rules/policies:

### Requirements

- 18 & older: Liability release form
- 16-17: Parental liability release form
- 12-15: Parental liability release form and must be accompanied by the parent or legal guardian during the fitness center visit

### Dress Code

Exercise attire is required. Appropriate exercise attire includes comfortable, loose-fitting clothing, as defined below.

- Pants:** Short or long exercise/warm-up pants are acceptable. Pants with belts, cut-off pants and/or jeans with metal rivets are dangerous and not allowed. Street clothing and/or business attire (suit & tie or skirt) compromises the safety of the wearer and reduces the acknowledged atmosphere and is not allowed.
- Shirts:** For hygiene purposes and to preserve a family environment, a shirt, which covers the torso, is required at all times. Cut-offs, sports bras, string tank tops, halter-tops or altered shirts of any kind that allow the full torso to show are not permitted. Altered shirts include any shirts that have cut-off sleeves, neckline or bottom. Shirts that are not altered but show the torso due to oversize armholes are also not acceptable.
- Shoes:** For safety purposes, closed-toed athletic footwear is required in all areas except the pool, shower/locker rooms or during Yoga. In an effort to minimize damage to the wood & rubber floors and carpet, the following footwear is prohibited:
  - dark-soled shoes which may damage or mark the wood floor/carpet;
  - any shoe suspected of damaging or marking the wood floor/carpet;
  - open-toed athletic footwear, sandals or flip-flops;
  - muddy, dusty or dirty shoes;
  - spikeless golf shoes;
  - Astroturf shoes, cleats or metal/rubber spiked shoes; running shoes.

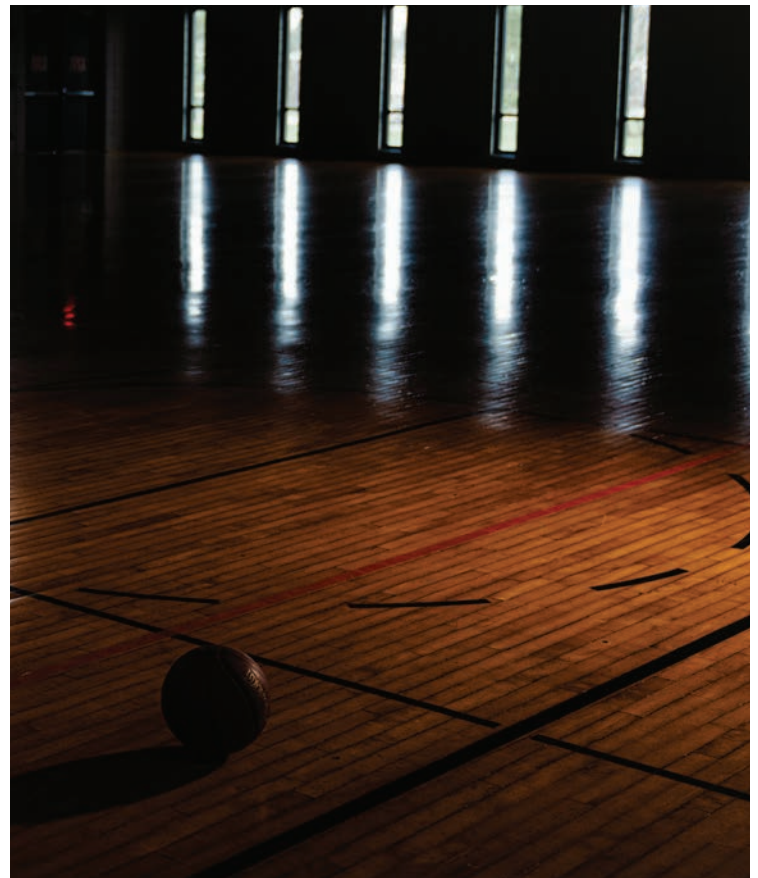

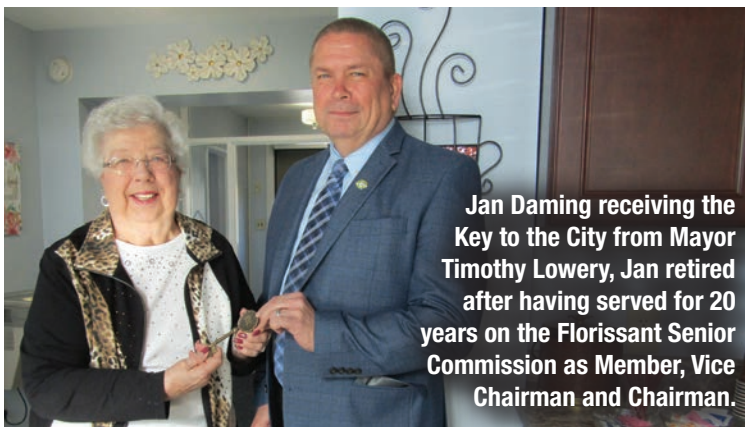

#### Below are a few things to remember. Social Security will never:

- Threaten arrest or legal action if someone does not immediately send money to resolve an overpayment
- Promise to increase benefits or resolve identity theft issues for a fee or by moving money into another account
- Require payment with a retail gift card, prepaid debit card, cryptocurrency, wire transfer, internet or by mailing cash.
- Send text or email messages that contain personal information

#### The Social Security Administration's scam prevention message is simple:

- Hang up on suspicious calls from "government officials" calling about a problem with your Social Security number or account.
- NEVER make payment with gift cards, wire transfers, or by mailing cash.

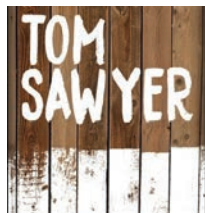

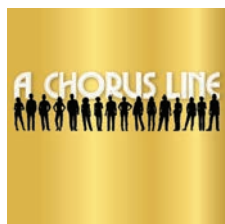
