## LANDMARK AND HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION MINUTES

The Landmark and Historic District Commission (LHDC) of the City of Florissant met in the second-floor conference room on Monday October 28, 2024, at 6:00 PM.

#### **INTRODUCTION AND WELCOME**

Dianne Lehmann-staff, Dawn Watkins-staff, Ray Underwood, Doug Keil, Theresa Matoushek, Steve Siebe, and Gary Thieme-all commission members. Petitioner Samual Boland was present with a request for a COA property at 650 Brown Street

#### **ROLL CALL**

Steve Siebe, Gary Thieme, Doug Keil, Theresa Matoushek, Ray Underwood and, Dawn Watkins, Dianne Lehmann were in attendance. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM.

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

August minutes presented for approval, Gary Meyer motioned to approve minutes as submitted, seconded by Gary Thieme, all approved.

#### Old Business

Item 1 – Discussion about Missouri Staff visit (SHPO) on 10/15/2024- Ethan Starr and Andrew Dial presentation was very well received. The event held at the Brock Wrath Weisse House was attended by over 30 people. SHPO gave lots of information about tax increment financing and various grant opportunities. Dianne said she is trying to compile a list of information for residents that were unable to attend the presentation.

- Item 2 Discussion about CLG presentation in Jefferson City on October 25, 2024.
   Dianne said that both her and Dawn Watkins attended the conference in Jefferson City.
   The primary focus was on distressed and abandoned historic properties and how to
   avoid demolition. Other points of interest were what other cities have done with grant
  - monies to help educate their residents about the importance of historic preservation.

#### New Business

Item 1 Samuel Boland 650 Brown Street Florissant MO 63031 Ward – 6

Sam Boland requested to demolish the existing 1 car garage at 650 Brown Street and replace it with a 30 X 50 Metal garage with 1 single door entrance. He also requested to paint the house and garage the same color after completion. He brought in a survey of the property and were the garage would be located in relationship to the house. Ray Underwood stated that we really wanted to work with everyone that came to the commission but he was concerned about a large metal building in the middle of the Old Town District. Theresa M expressed the same concern not only about the material that he was using but the size of the garage would be bigger than the house. Dianne gave Sam the color samples for the Old Town District and informed him that paint colors would have to be similar to those approved by LHDC. Sam said that would not be a problem.

Steve Siebe asked about windows and was told no windows would be on the building. Steve and Ray both said they thought the building looked too industrial for the Old Town area and asked if there was any way the builder could make it more cohesive to the look of the house. Sam explained that a building made out of wood is cost prohibitive. If he is unable to move forward with the building as proposed he will have to find somewhere else to store his cars.

The commission said they would like more information as it pertains to building codes and if a metal  $50 \times 30$  building is an approved structure at this property. Dianne said she would have the Building Commissioner review the plans and decide if this would be code. We would get back to the petitioner after plan review and zoning has looked at the plans.



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#### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION:**

Before the commission is Missouri American Water (MOAW) in partnership with the City of Florissant requesting approval to install an 8-ft black vinyl coated chain link fence around water tower in Tower Park, 1060 Rue St Catherine, in the "HB" Historic District.
